1. Alcohol

Only alcohol purchased on site will be acceptable at this event, no alcohol can be brought in and bag searches may be carried out.

No under 18yrs are permitted to drink at the event or in the surrounding vicinity of the event.

Please bring valid ID as proof of age, checks may be carried out – we will be operating ‘Challenge 25’ policy. You may be refused service at the bar tenders discretion and asked to leave.

2. Tickets and entry

Last entry into the event without a pre-paid ticket is 8.45pm.

You will be issued a wristband, this will allow you to come in and out of the event

Families - Under 16yrs are free but must be accompanied by an adult to gain access into the event.

Please bring valid ID as proof of age, checks may be carried out.

You will not be permitted into this event if you arrive drunk.

Search will be carried out at the entrance to this event. The staff reserve the right to confiscate items which may cause danger or disruption to the Party in the Park – without ticket refunds.

3. Safety of Children

Please take responsibility for the children in your group, even if they are teenagers. Please make arrangements for a meeting point in case your party gets separated. You could write your mobile number on the issued wristbands, or on their arm (if this can be covered up) – and inform your child of who to approach on arrival should they be separated.

Lost or found children should be reported to a steward immediately.

Please note under 16yrs may not be able to leave the event without you with them.

The suppliers for activities do not offer a crèche facility.

4. First Aid

There will be first aid provision on site at the event to deal with any first aid issues that arise at the event.

5. Behaviour

Anti-social behaviour will not be accepted and will lead to you been asked to leave the event. This is at the discretion of staff – not your opinion of anti-social. This is a family event and we expect people to behave in a respectful manner.

Incidents of crime and disorder will be reported to the police.

CCTV will be covering elements of the event.
